Set in a national park on the shores of Ago Bay, Amanemu embraces the ancient Japanese tradition of *onsen* (mineral hot springs) and the culinary traditions of this gourmet region. The resort's name is drawn from the Sanskrit-derived word for 'peace' and *nemu*, Japanese for 'sharing joy'.

Activities & Excursions

The local sites and activities mentioned below are just a few of the area's many attractions - all easily accessible from Amanemu.

Ise Shima National Park

The beautiful forests of this National Park surround Amanemu and offer extensive hiking trails. Every season offers different vistas, from pink cherry blossoms in spring to red maple leaves in autumn.

Kumano Kodō

These ancient UNESCO-protected pilgrimage routes crisscross the Kii Peninsula, winding through verdant forests.

Yokoyama Observatory

Enjoy spectacular views of the peninsula, its saw-toothed coastline and Ago Bay's islets from the top of this 203m (666ft) structure.

Sea Expeditions

Guests are able to explore the many islets and pearl rafts of Ago Bay by boat.

Pearl Work Shop

Ago Bay is the origin of the akoya pearl oyster. Guests can visit the pearl oyster farms, experience the delicate art of pearl extraction and browse pearl accessories.

Fishing

Renowned for its fresh seafood, Ago Bay is a popular fishing destination and Amanemu can arrange fishing excursions with local fishermen.

Shima School of Nature

Immersing visitors in the natural wealth of Ise Shima, the school offers a range of excursions and activities from kayaking and lobster fishing, to mountain biking and hiking.

Ise Jingū

The revered Shinto shrine of Ise Jingū was first erected in the late 600s. Dedicated to the goddess Amaterasu-ōmikami, it is said to house the Yata no Kagami, a sacred mirror.
